ASEA/AFSCME Local 52 Health Benefits Trust Board of Trustees - Special Election Notice of Nominations and Elections 2026

The Board of Trustees is holding a Special Election and is soliciting nominations to fill a vacant At Large (Statewide) position. The term for this position will be September 2026 to September 2028. Trustee Nominations will be accepted from June 29 through July 17, 2026.

Candidate Requirements

To be considered for election to the Board of Trustees, an individual must be:

- An ASEA/AFSCME Local 52 member in good standing
- An ASEA/AFSCME Local 52 Health Benefits Trust participant
- An employee of the State of Alaska in the General Government Unit whose status is any of the following: full-time, part-time, seasonal, on leave of absence, or on layoff
- The At Large (Statewide candidate) is elected by the general ASEA/AFSCME Local 52 members in good standing who are Health Trust participants.

Trustee Responsibilities

The position of Trustee is serious, time-consuming and uncompensated. The term of office is four (4) years. Since this position has been vacated prior to the end of the term, the term for this position will be two (2) years, ending September 2028. Nominees must be willing to participate in the responsibilities outlined below.

The Board of Trustees' responsibilities include, but are not limited to,

- Administration of the plan of benefits
- Administration of the Trust Fund assets solely in the interest of the participants and their beneficiaries
- Compliance with Internal Revenue Code and other applicable laws
- Payment of current benefits and reasonable and prudent expenses necessary to manage the Trust

- The investment of contributions and other income not required for the payment of benefits or expenses.

The Board of Trustees owe a fiduciary duty to the participants and beneficiaries of this Trust and by law, all investment decisions must comply with Internal Revenue Code and the prudent investor rule.

Trustees should expect to attend approximately four (4) two-day board meetings and one (1) three-day board meeting per year. Subject to approval by the ASEA Business Manager, Trustees receive union release time and/or ASEA Business Leave for work time needed to attend Trust meetings. Trustees are reimbursed by the Health Trust for reasonable travel expenses, defined in Trust policies, for travel necessary to carry out their responsibilities. Trustees should expect to spend additional time on teleconference meetings, committee assignments, and reviewing written materials in preparation for assignments and meetings.

Submitting a Nomination Petition

There are two ways to obtain an Information Packet:

2. Go to the Health Trust website: aseahealth.org and click on "More" from the navigation bar at the top of the website homepage, then "Running for Trustee". Print out the appropriate documents listed under "Interested in Running?"

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Submitting a Nomination Petition *continued*

As part of the nomination process, the individual must sign the following documents to show that they have read, understand and consent to them:

- Trustee Agreement
- Trustee Application
- Trustee Responsibilities Overview
- Trustee Agreement
- Statement of Qualifications (up to 450 words).

In accordance with election criteria established in the Trust Agreement, effective September 28, 2005, a Statement of Qualifications should be limited to information on the Nominee's credentials for the position of Trustee, taking into consideration the individuals' knowledge of employee benefits issues, special training pertaining to benefit plans and/or fiduciary responsibility and other unique benefit qualifications, training, or knowledge. The Statement of Qualifications will be included on the website ballot and with mailed paper ballots. **The statement should be typed using MS Word and must be submitted via email as a Word document attachment.**

An optional photo may also be submitted to be included on the website ballot:

- Submit a digital photo saved in a JPEG (jpg) file format
- Photo should be a head shot
- Equipment should be set to the largest photo size
- Photos should be sent via email

The Trust will accept Nomination Petitions by mail, fax or by attaching it to an email through "Contact Us". Fax submissions must include a cover sheet stating "Attention: Trust Administrator".

The deadline to submit nominations is 5:00 PM, AKDT - July 17, 2026

Election Period: August 03 through September 03, 2026

ONLINE VOTING: Beginning August 03, 2026, members can log in to the secure section of the ASEA Health Trust website, www.aseahealth.org to vote.

Not a registered member on the website yet? It's simple, quick and can be done at any time. If you have any questions, contact the Trust Administrator at 866-553-8206. If you would prefer a paper ballot, contact the election monitor, Sramek-Hightower CPA at 907-677-3320.

The election will close at 5:00 PM AKDT on September 3, 2026. The votes will be tallied on September 4, 2026 with the results being posted to the ASEA Health Trust website at www.aseahealth.org.

Online and paper ballots will only be available to ASEA members in good standing.

To ensure you meet the eligibility requirements, please contact the union to verify your correct mailing address and workstation. (The union maintains the official records of the members workstation in the various regions, not the Health Trust),

The elected Trustee from the election is the candidate receiving the majority of votes cast. In an election with 3 or more candidates, the candidate receiving the greatest number of votes will be declared the winner, provided the candidate receives at least 40% of the valid ballots cast. If no candidate receives at least 40% of the valid ballots cast, a runoff election will be held between the two candidates with the greatest number of votes. If only one nomination is received for an elected Trustee position, and if the nominee is determined to be eligible, the Board will declare that nominee elected. No write-in candidates will be permitted. The terms for this Trustee position will take effect following action by the Board.
